

What should I do if I see someone else being bullied?

If you see someone else being bullied, it is important that you help that person. You should never walk away and ignore the bullying if you see someone else being bullied, because the bully will keep on upsetting that person.

Try speaking to the child that you think is being bullied and see if they talk to you. Encourage them to talk to an adult.

Offer to speak to an adult with them if that helps.

What is bullying?

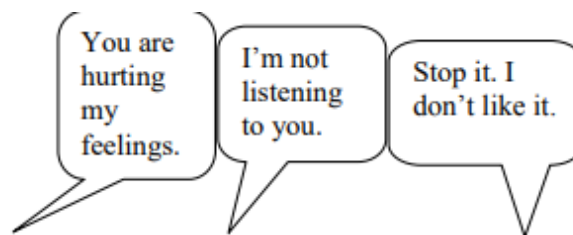
Bullying is not:

- Falling out with your friends
- Someone hurting you by accident
- Someone not wanting to play with you
- Someone not inviting you to their house

What should I do if I think I am being bullied?

- Walk away
- Don't hurt them
- Don't shout at them
- Ignore them
- Tell someone

Always remember that if you are being bullied, it is not your fault and you are NOT alone.

What will the adults in school do?
